Course objectives (50-100 words):	<p>The main objective of the course is achieving that the student become familiar with the complex institutional arrangement of the European Union. The course will contain the composition, the working methods of the different organs and their participation in the decision (law) making process. The other aim of the course is to provide students with a comprehensive overview of the basic issues of legal harmonization in the EU. The course focuses on the constitutional foundation, as well as different modes and instruments of harmonization. We also examine legal harmonization as a method of governance in the European Union. A special attention is paid to the role of the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) as a key (though non-traditional) actor of the legal harmonisation process.</p>
