Andrea Csereklyei DLA, Assistant professor

Her debut on the opera stage was in 1998 (Pamina), followed by recitals where she mainly performs as a soloist of classical and baroque oratories. She frequently sings at song recitals, and has been involved in the premier of several contemporary works. She is a soloist of leading orchestras in Hungary and a returning guest of different festivals. She has participated in a number of radio and television programs, and is the soloist of multiple records in the "World Premiere" series of medieval, renaissance and baroque music, published by Hungaroton Records. In 1999 she was awarded the Artisjus Prize, she won the Annie Fischer scholarship in 2000-2001. In 2014 and 2019 she won the scholarship of the Hungarian Academy of Arts. She has been a guest artist in Vienna, Salzburg, Moscow, Cluj Napoca, Bucharest, Bratislava, Prague, the Hague, Florence, Munich, Stuttgart, London, Mexico and China. She held successful masterclasses in the Czech Republic and China.

She obtained her DLA in 2018 at Liszt Academy in Budapest. She is currently assistant professor at Miskolc University and voice training teacher at Liszt Academy in Budapest.

László Bartal

Conductor

He was born in Budapest in 1962, and continued violin, piano and organ studies at elementary music school. He studied choir leading at Liszt Ferenc Academy of Music from 1980 to 1985, studying with masters including Péter Erdei, József Maklári and Kamilló Lendvay. He graduated at the conductor training course in 1990, where his master was Ervin Lukács. He participated in Yuri Simonov's, Kurt Sanderling's (Weimar) and Helmuth Rilling's (Leipzig) master classes. From 1986 to 1990 he was the conductor of the Budafok Youth Orchestra, the predecessor of Ernő Dohányi Symphony Orchestra. He joined the Hungarian State Opera House in 1986 as a répétiteur-conductor. He also worked as a rehearsing conductor in Augsburg between 1990 and 1993. From 1994 he worked for the Csokonai Theatre, Debrecen as principal conductor, and from 1999 to 2001 as musical director. He was artistic director and conductor with the Symphony Orchestra of the Budapest Technical University from 1994 to 2002 and the Szabolcs County Symphony Orchestra, Nyíregyháza from 1997 to 2003. Between 2002 and 2004 he was the head of the Opera Department at Liszt Ferenc Academy of Music, and musical director with the Miskolc National Theatre from 2003 to 2007. From 2011 associate professor and leader of the Miskolc University Symphony Orchestra. Besides numerous orchestras in the country (Szeged, Pécs, Szombathely), he has conducted the Orchestra of the Budapest Philharmonic Society and the Budapest Symphony Orchestra, and made several radio recordings with the latter.

Bence Szepesi has achieved considerable recognition both in his native Hungary and around the world. A graduate of the Béla Bartók Conservatoire of Music, Franz Liszt Academy of Music, Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse de Paris. He currently holds a number of positions: he is the President of the Hungarian Clarinet

and Saxophone Society, Principal Clarinet of the Dohnányi Symphony Orchestra in Budapest, Artistic Leader of the Budapest Saxophone Quartet, Professor of Saxophone at University of Miskolc and Country Chair of the International Clarinet Association. He has given master-classes across Europe and the USA, among other places at the Conservatorio Nicolini in Piacenza, Italy, Music School of Vhrnika and Summer Saxophone Academy in Podsreda in Slovenia, Gnessin Academy of Music in Moscow, Music Academy in Wrocław in Poland, and in numerous venues in the United States: Stony Brook University (NY), University of Central Florida, The Juilliard School of Music (NY), Manhattan School of Music and California State University, etc. The early part of his career was distinguished by a number of prizes and competition awards, among them the first prize in the Budapest Clarinet Competition in 1985, third prize in the International Clarinet Association Competition in Ghent in 1993, first prize in the Chamber Music Competition in Budapest in 1997 and the second prize in the International Saxophone Quartet Competition in Dortmund in 2000. Now he frequently finds himself a juror on such competitions, serving in 2008–9 as President of the Jury at the International Saxophone Competition in Sestri-Levante, Italy, as well as being a jury member of clarinet and saxophone competitions in Serbia, Slovenia and his native Hungary - at the National Clarinet and Saxophone Competition in Győr. In 2011 he was awarded the Artisjus Prize by the Hungarian Composers' Union in Budapest.

He has appeared as a soloist and as a chamber and orchestral musician in Austria, Belgium, Canada, China, Croatia, the Czech Republic, France, Germany, Greece, Israel, Italy, Japan, Mauritius, Morocco, the Netherlands, Poland, Qatar, Romania, Russia, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, Taiwan and the USA. As a soloist, Mr.Szepesi has performed in Bangkok, Thailand, Singapore (Esplanade Concert Hall), Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, Chicago, USA (Chicago Cultural Center, Preston Bradley Hall), Washington DC., USA (Katzen Arts Center) and 3 times at the world most prestigious concert hall: The Carnegie Hall, New York, USA. Mr. Szepesi is a brand ambassador of D'Addario Woodwinds (USA), RZ Clarinets (Czech), BG France, and an exclusive artist of AGP Agency New York.


